

"Debate structure and organization for newbies

The debate is won by convincing the jury that what you say is more important and relevant than what the other team is saying. You cannot just win a debate by denying another person and calling them ignorant and stupid.

Your logical reasoning pushes your judges to give you extra scores once they notice that your arguments and supporting details are stronger than your opponent, therefore you have to be very vigilant at this point.

Well, we are here to help you with this tricky job. Let's become familiar with **how to start an essay** and in what manner you should organize and structure your debate. This blog will help you a lot if you are a beginner and trying to improve your debating skills.

First of all, you are given a topic for a debate. You must have some knowledge about a few emerging **debate topics** to be able to understand the topic at once. Then comes the first step, to construct your debate is to collect difficult terms related to your topic and understand them and note down their definition. This helps you to narrow down your topic and allows you to formulate specific arguments for any possible counter-argument.



While making your arguments and preparing the reading material you must practice debating to know if you are exceeding the time limit or the opposite. If you are taking a lot of time then reduce some extra information and if you think you are ending before the expected time limit then try to add some points same as an [Essay Writing Service](#).

If you are not sure which path you should take first start by brainstorming or just making a mind map on a notebook. Once you are done with this process your major arguments become more obvious than before.

You search on the topic for which you are speaking and once you are done with that you start searching on the expected opposing ideas. You try to search for what might be the possible arguments to counter them and what real-life examples you should talk about to strengthen your argument.

While delivering a debate you try to note down the information or the arguments your opposing team is talking about and organize the answers one by one. Organization in your debate is essential as it helps you to go smoothly leaving an impression that whatever you are talking about is credible and you know enough to explain it further. But not organizing your debate and just talking too much will cause you to lose your focus and you will possibly run out of time.

When you are debating it is essential that your main eye contact with the judges as they are the ones who are assessing your arguments. When you are confident judges are more likely to believe in your arguments because it affirms that it is credible information and you believe in it as well. Clearly and slowly make sure that you can cover all the information without running out of time. Also, use hand gestures properly but do not over do them it leaves a bad impression.

Your debate begins with an introductory part that is followed by your main arguments. You deliver all the information and examples while discussing the main arguments. But when you are done with all the points, it is advised that you should deliver a summary that brings up and elaborate on the points you made as well as mention the flaws in the opposition's points. This is a good chance to make your opposition's point weaker. Your summary helps you gain an edge over your arguments and secures your victory.

At the end of the debate do not try to bring new information because by then you will already be left with limited time and you won't be able to finish the argument.
