

Know More About Comma-splice Errors to Make a Perfect Classification Essay

Even experts make mistakes in writing if they do not proofread their work or if they have not paid due attention while writing. No one can completely rule out the possibility of making mistakes while writing so practice hard and stay motivated. Even when you cannot completely get rid of writing mistakes, you can significantly reduce them.

We write classification essays to make categories. We might come across disconnected and disjointed objects and ideas that we require to put in specific groupings. Then, an [essay writer](#) tries to link up seemingly different things and puts them in specific classifications. This is the job of a classification essay.

In classification essays, we are required to draw connections between various things. For that matter, we write long sentences because we have multiple things to talk about in a single statement. While writing long sentences, we are at risk of making grammatical mistakes. The most commonly made grammatical mistakes are run-ons and comma-splice.



In order to reduce comma splice errors in your classification essay, you need to know what leads to these errors. If you have not already noticed, we have discussed one reason just now: writing long sentences. I know this because I like writing long and complicated sentences and I have a history of making and correcting comma-splices in my writings. This one time I went up to my friend and asked him to read a classification essay that I had written. He sat down to [write my essay](#) and then he told me how his work was different from mine in terms of sentence fragments and comma splices. This proved to be a great help and I started to improve since that day.

We make comma-splice errors when we do not proofread our essays. Like any other essay type, we need to pay attention to writing a classification essay. We are in a different state of mind while we are writing an essay. We do not even remember the first half of the sentences when we reach the end of that very sentence. That is why unless we do not proofread, we might not be aware of the excessive use of commas in our classification essay.

Comma-splice errors result in sentence fragments and they make our essay look really incoherent. As we are to make connections in a classification essay, it serves as the major drawback to our essay. Reading the sentences out loud can make us realize how broken our sentences sound to others. Also, while we are reading a text, the natural pitch and highs and lows greatly help us put commas in the right place. Other than this, getting help from an **essay writing service** also helps in doing everything properly.

Comma-splice is the exact opposite of run-on. In run-on, you write fused sentences while in comma splice you make too many fragments in a single sentence. These fragments result from using too many commas that we call comma-splice errors. Like run-ons, comma splice errors can also be reduced by using alternate punctuation marks and by writing shorter sentences.

Again, the key to fixing any grammatical error is practice. Your practice would help you avoid run-on errors in your classification essay. If you want to make your classification essay a perfect one, free of comma splice errors then make sure that you do not join your independent clauses with a comma. You can instead use conjunction or just write them as two independent sentences. You can also fuse them to form a single sentence if you want to fix your comma-splice error.
