"Exposure to poverty leads to brain damage, reduced cognitive capacity and decreased impulse control," wrote Thomas Insel in a 2009 article for the American Journal of Psychiatry. This was a surprise to psychologists, who had already established a strong link between poverty and behavioral problems, including violent behavior, delinquency and impulsivity. "Exposure to poverty leads to brain damage," Insel's article began. "Reduced cognitive capacity and decreased impulse control." Insel was director of the National Institute of Mental Health at the time. Exposure to poverty, Insel warned, "can lead to long-term neurological changes that impair cognitive capacity and inhibit impulse control." Insel wrote that studies have found that poverty affects the chemical composition of the brains of children living in impoverished households. Exposure to poverty can also increase the possibility of suffering neurological damage and mental illness. "In fact, environmental factors — such as poverty and violence — can so radically alter the developing brain that it permanently changes the very structure of the brain," Insel wrote. "If the poverty and violence are severe, they can lead to long-term neurological damage that impairs cognitive capacity and inhibits impulse control."
